SENIOR YEARS VETERINARY SUPPORT SCHEME

Adopting an older pet can be a rewarding experience in many ways. An older cat has much to offer in terms of easy and mature companionship and a generally more serene approach to life and should never be under-valued.

This branch appreciates that ownership of a mature cat can sometimes involve the requirement for age-related veterinary care and in order to assist those adopting an older cat, we offer financial support for age-related medication and treatment. Anyone adopting an older cat from this branch is eligible to register **for free** in our “Senior Years Veterinary Support Scheme” and entitlement to claim is effective immediately.

What are the terms of the Scheme?

- Cats qualifying with no medical problems at the time of adoption can be registered in order to claim for future age-related illnesses.
- The scheme is restricted to cover **age-related veterinary treatment only** and will cover conditions such as, diabetes, arthritic, kidney, thyroid and dental treatment.
- The scheme **does not** cover routine booster vaccinations, flea or worming treatment, accident, injury or euthanasia.

How to make a claim

- Veterinary bills should be settled by the client.
- The receipted bill (or copy) must be on the vet practice’s headed paper and must detail the owner’s name and address and the name of the cat.

- Claims for regular or on-going treatment/medication should be made quarterly, unless otherwise agreed in advance with the Rehoming Manager.
